# 7.17 Role of Students in Institutional Decision-Making

**Policy:** Piedmont Community College (PCC) encourages and provides opportunities for students to participate in the College's institutional decision-making process through the Student Government Association (SGA) and/or by serving on College Institutional Standing Committees.

#### Procedure:

Section 1: Committee Appointments

- 1.1. The President of the SGA is an ex-officio, non-voting member of the PCC Board of Trustees.
- 1.2. Upon recommendations from the campus community, students are appointed to and approved by the Executive Council of the College to serve as active members on the following institutional standing committees:
  - 1.2.1. Community Engagement
  - 1.2.2. Curriculum
  - 1.2.3. Distance Learning

- 1.2.4. Enrollment Management
- 1.2.5. Environment/Safety
- 1.2.6. Institutional Effectiveness
- 1.2.7. Learning Commons
- 1.2.8. Marketing
- 1.2.9. Keep the PACE Steering
- 1.2.10. Student Affairs
- 1.2.11. Technology
- 1.3. Students serving on program advisory committees are appointed by the program area.
- 1.4. Other college ad hoc committees, task forces, or focus groups are established periodically and may seek student representation.
