The Nurse Aide I curriculum prepares individuals to work under the supervision of licensed nursing professionals in performing nursing care and services for persons of all ages. Topics include growth and development, personal care, vital signs, communication, nutrition, medical asepsis, therapeutic activities, accident and fire safety, household environment and equipment management, family resources and services, and employment skills. Upon completion, the student may be eligible for listing as a Nurse Aide I and other selected Nurse Aide registries as determined by the local program of study.



It provides entry-level IT security professionals with the knowledge to identify risk, participate in risk mitigation activities, provide infrastructure, information, operational, and application security. Students who successfully complete this course will be eligible for the SYO-601 exam, which covers the application of security controls to maintain confidentiality, integrity, and availability; identification of appropriate technologies and products; and troubleshooting security events and incidents with expanded coverage of critical networking concepts to help security professionals work with networking practitioners.




