COURSE DESCRIPTION

To prepare students for the North Carolina Paramedic level exam by providing instruction as set forth by the requirements of the Department of Transportation (DOT) and the North Carolina Office of Emergency Services (NCOEMS). Students will be eligible to test National Registry Paramedic as well concluding successful passing of this course.

PREREQUISITES

- ♦ Possession of a valid and active North Carolina EMT Credential or NREMT credential.
- ♦ High school diploma or high school equivalency.
- ♦ Successful completion of college-level English, or within the previous 12 months complete a written assessment placing the individual into college-level English.
- ♦ Successful completion of college-level Math, or within the previous 12 months complete a written assessment placing the individual into college-level Math.
- ♦ Successful completion of PCC EMS Paramedic Preliminary Bootcamp
